Touching upon the death of Jonathan DOWNEY

The following matters are found

1. Name of the deceased

Jonathan DOWNEY

2. Injury or disease causing death: Injuries caused by an explosion

3. Time, place and circumstance at or in which injury was sustained ('narrative conclusion')

On the morning of 7 July 2005, Jonathan Downey was on board a westbound Circle Line tube train. At 08.49, shortly after the train had left Edgware Road Underground Station in the direction of Paddington Underground Station, an explosion occurred when a bomb was detonated by a terrorist in the second carriage of the train. Jonathan Downey was in the same carriage and was killed by the explosion.
