Touching upon the death of Lee Christopher HARRIS

The following matters are found

1. Name of the deceased

Lee Christopher HARRIS

- 2. Injury or disease causing death: Injuries caused by an explosion
- 3. Time, place and circumstance at or in which injury was sustained ('narrative conclusion')

On the morning of 7 July 2005, Lee Harris was on board a westbound Piccadilly Line tube train. At 08.49, shortly after the train had left King's Cross Underground Station in the direction of Russell Square Underground Station, an explosion occurred when a bomb was detonated by a terrorist in the first carriage of the train. Lee Harris was in the same carriage. He was blown out of the carriage by the force of the explosion and was subsequently found on the tracks on the nearside of the train, next to where the fourth

carriage had come to rest. He was tended to and comforted by members of the emergency services. He was subsequently removed from the tracks and was carried back to King's Cross Underground Station, and then to the surface. At about 1059 he was put into an ambulance and was taken to the Royal London Hospital, where he was treated until he died on 15 July 2005.
