



Coroner's Inquests into the London Bombings of 7 July 2005

An inquisition taken from our Sovereign Lady the Queen

At the Royal Courts of Justice

Opened on 15 July 2005

And, upon adjournment, continuing from 11 October 2010 to 6 May 2011

Touching upon the death of Gladys Ama WUNDOWA

The following matters are found

1. Name of the deceased

Gladys Ama WUNDOWA

2. Injury or disease causing death: Injuries caused by an explosion

3. Time, place and circumstance at or in which injury was sustained ('narrative conclusion')

On the morning of 7 July 2005, Gladys Wundowa was travelling on the upper deck of a No.30 bus in the direction of Islington. Upon leaving Euston Station, the bus was diverted from its route and drove south down Upper Woburn Place. At 09.47, as the bus travelled south through Tavistock Square, an explosion occurred when a bomb was detonated by a terrorist on the upper deck of the bus. Gladys Wundowa was blown on to the road behind by the force of the explosion, and suffered very severe injuries. She was

tended to and comforted by a doctor from the British Medical Association, members of the public and police officers. She was carried into the courtyard of the BMA building, where she received further medical treatment. She died at about 1040.
