An inquisition taken from our Sovereign Lady the Queen

Opened on 19 July 2005

And, upon adjournment, continuing from 11 October 2010 to 6 May 2011

Touching upon the death of Richard Martyn GRAY

The following matters are found

1. Name of the deceased

Richard Martyn GRAY

2. Injury or disease causing death: Injuries caused by an explosion

3. Time, place and circumstance at or in which injury was sustained ('narrative conclusion')

On the morning of 7 July 2005, Richard Gray was on board an eastbound Circle Line tube train. At 08.49, as the train approached Aldgate Underground Station from the direction of Liverpool Street Underground Station, an explosion occurred when a bomb was detonated by a terrorist in the second carriage of the train. Richard Gray was in the same carriage. He was blown out of the train and killed by the explosion. His body was subsequently found on the tracks next to where the third carriage of the train had come to rest.
