And, upon adjournment, continuing from 11 October 2010 to 6 May 2011

Touching upon the death of Marie Joanne HARTLEY

The following matters are found

1. Name of the deceased

Marie Joanne HARTLEY

- 2. Injury or disease causing death: Injuries caused by an explosion
- 3. Time, place and circumstance at or in which injury was sustained ('narrative conclusion')

On the morning of 7 July 2005, Marie Hartley was travelling on the upper deck of a No.30 bus in the direction of Islington. Upon leaving Euston Station, the bus was diverted from its route and drove south down Upper Woburn Place. At 09.47, as the bus travelled south through Tavistock Square, an explosion occurred when a bomb was detonated by a terrorist on the upper deck of the bus. Marie Hartley was blown on to the road behind by the force of the explosion, and suffered very severe injuries. She was tended to and

comforted by doctors from the British Medical Association and by police officers. She was carried into the courtyard of the BMA building, but died shortly afterwards, at about 1005.
